Union Stewards, also called Shop Stewards, are the eyes, ears and voice of the Union at the workplace.

As representatives of CUPE in the workplace, stewards communicate on an equal footing with management.

They also get the satisfaction of knowing they contribute to a better quality of life at the work site by helping to resolve

issues before they become full-blown problems.

Being a Steward is a vital job. In fact, many call it the most essential job in labour-management relations at the worksite. Without stewards to make sure management lives up to its responsibilities under the agreement, the best collective agreement would be worthless. Stewards get the satisfaction knowing they

can help their co-workers solve problems. Stewards receive training in collective agreement interpretation, conflict resolution, problem solving, etc.

Training helps you become a good resource of knowledge for your co-workers and others with questions about your collective agreement, labour law, employer policies and how they should be applied.

Being a steward is a rewarding way of making a contribution to your workplace.

Co-workers at the worksite with easy access to stewards have found them to be an invaluable resource. Increasing numbers of departments and worksites appreciate the value of stewards in heading off problems. Yet not every worksite area has stewards, so we're looking to remedy the situation. Stewards have the opportunity to meet with other stewards from other CUPE locals for educational activities, exchange of ideas and social events. All you

need to do to become a steward is have a keen interest in people and an enthusiasm for CUPE ideas and activities. You should enjoy helping others and have the desire and initiative to look after the interests of fellow members. Training and assistance will be provided.

So why not consider being a union steward? While you may find the role challenging, you will certainly gain satisfaction of doing an important job for your co-workers.
